

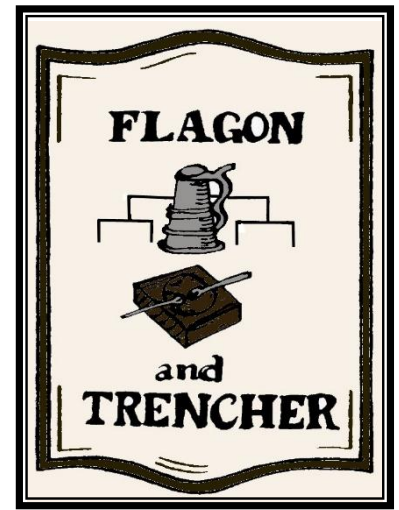

The King George predates the colony of Pennsylvania and is one of the oldest continuously operating inns in the United States. Members and their guests will gather at 12 noon to renew acquaintances and greet new members. The buffet luncheon will feature broiled salmon, grilled chicken, vegetable pasta, salads, etc. Soft drinks will be provided and a cash bar will be available.

Our special guest will be Michael Carver, a historical interpreter and reenactor. He is known as “The Colonial Brewer” and will present a program on the history of colonial taverns and the importance of ale in the lives of our ancestors. King George II Inn

Located on the banks of the Delaware River in Bristol, PA, the King George II dates to 1681 when it served travelers crossing the Delaware river on the nearby ferry. The inn is located on the former King’s Road, established in 1686 by the Pennsylvania Provincial Council to connect Philadelphia with New York City. George Washington and John Adams were both guests at the inn.



The KG II was part of Washington’s famous attack at Trenton on Christmas night, 1776. Washington and his army would cross the Delaware River north of Trenton. Additional troops gathered at the inn and planned to cross the river at Bristol to attack from the south.

However, a massive build-up of ice in the river prevented their crossing. The troops enjoyed beer at the inn while Washington made history.
