JOHN JACKSON

Innholder, Cambridge, Massachusetts, c. 1672

(from a work in progress entitled Y^e Olde Lookinge Glass by Alexander Bannerman)

JOHN JACKSON, usually referred to as "Lieutenant," was born near the year 1645. The location of his birth has not been learned. His first wife was Sarah _____, who died without issue November 15, 1700.* His second wife was Deborah Fifield, daughter of Giles and Judith (Carter) (Converse) Fifield, born July 4, 1673 at Charlestown, Massachusetts.† John died at Cambridge, Massachusetts on September 26, 1709, aged 64.‡ His wife survived him and died at Woburn, Massachusetts on February 5, 1724.§ Although Jackson's parentage is not known, he is believed to be a near relative of Richard Jackson of Cambridge, for John inherited Richard's property in Cambridge.** The property, located on the northwesterly angle of Brattle Street and Brattle Square, became the location of John's inn. He began operation in about the year 1672, and was succeeded in business in 1695 by Capt. Josiah Parker.
