THOMAS SNOW

-1668/9

Innholder, Boston, Massachusetts, 1667

Thomas Snow was probably born in England. He was in Boston in 1636 where he died 1668-1669. He married about 1637, probably in Boston, Milcah (Melcas, Meletia, Meletiah) Kelway, daughter of Walter and Joanna (-) Kelway of Chelmsford, County Essex, England. She had come with two sisters and their brother to New England where she died after 1669, probably in Boston.

Thomas Snow is listed as a Barber in Boston in 1636. He was made a freeman 18 May 1642. Thomas was admitted to the church in Boston 5 September 1641. In 1667 he was an innholder at "The Sign of the Dove" in Boston.

Snow's will dated 10 November 1668 was proved 28 April 1669. In it he left all his estate to his wife Milcah who later died intestate. The estate consisted of a house and land "scituate and being in Boston and is butted and bounded on the south side by the Streete that leads from Deacon Eliots house westward to the Sea, northwesterly by a Lane that leads from the sd Streete to the Comon or trayning feild, north-east by the land to Thomas Platts, easterly by the land of Bernard Trott." The estate was divided among his son Thomas and his three daughters.
